<p>Quinte Hospice, Belleville</p> <p>Provides individuals, their families and caregivers with compassionate end-of-life care, by attending to their physical, psychological and practical needs, and offering empathetic care to those who are grieving.</p>	Western	7,956.55
<p>Almost Home, Kingston</p> <p>Provides a place of comfort and respite for families whose children are receiving medical treatment in Kingston area hospitals. Daily accommodation for eleven families at Almost Home makes it easy for parents to maintain their bedside vigil. Children can frequently leave their hospital beds for a few hours to spend time with their families in a home-like setting. Children attending clinics have a place to go between appointments, or to stay overnight if necessary.</p>	Central	7,956.55
<p>Loaves & Fishes, Brockville</p> <p>Provides a nutritious healthy meal to people for a subsidized fee or a dollar. Operated by a volunteer board who work in food prep or on food service, delivering meals, salads, desserts and coffee to those who need a hot home cooked meal.</p>	Eastern	7,956.55
<p>Grace Inn, Belleville</p> <p>21-bed emergency shelter for adults in Belleville and surrounding areas, with a special focus on dignity, community and mentorship.</p>	Western	7,956.55
<p>St. Mary's Drop-In Center, Kingston</p> <p>Caring for the material, emotional, and spiritual needs of the homeless and those most in need in the city of Kingston.</p>	Central	7,956.55
<p>Anchor of Hope, Madoc</p> <p>Christian charitable organization offering assistance to anyone facing an unexpected pregnancy or challenges due to pregnancy or abortion.</p>	Western	7,956.55
<p>St. Vincent de Paul, Kingston, Brockville and Belleville</p> <p>Provide practical supports to our vulnerable population through a variety of programs, including clothing and furniture vouchers and emergency food programs.</p>	Central, Western and Eastern	7,956.55 (\$2,652.16 each)
<p>Project Rachel, Queensborough</p> <p>Offers confidential and non-judgemental post-abortion support for women and men who have experienced abortion.</p>	Western	7,956.55

<p>Holy Cross Knights, Kemptville</p> <p>Food bank that provides emergency grocery supports to anyone who requires assistance.</p>	Eastern	7,956.55
<p>Interval House, Leeds & Grenville/Lanark</p> <p>Centre for women survivors of intimate partner violence and their children which takes a holistic approach to helping women and children leave abuse behind and start new lives, free of violence.</p>	Eastern	7,956.55
<p>Victim Services, Leeds & Grenville/Lanark</p> <p>Community-based program that provides immediate, confidential, crisis intervention services, practical assistance, information, referrals and emotional support to persons affected by crime, tragedy and / or disaster, to help lessen the trauma of the experience and to help people cope with the longer-term impact of what has occurred.</p>	Eastern	\$7,956.55
<p>Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph, Peru, Mexico and Dominican Republic</p> <p>Helping the affirmed with their medical needs. In spite of the limited facilities, the clinic in Dominican Republic can receive up to 200 out-patients a day. The Education Center teaches skills such as sewing, carpentry, and cooking to impoverished young people.
